Kindergarten

This week in Christ Light we hear the lessons of "God's People Finally entering the Promised Land" and "Rahab and the Spies".

This week our focus in on the letter N. The words for the week are "not", "what" and "all". The children have been working hard on sounding out words also. Many are doing really well with CVC (consonant, vowel, consonant) words. Please continue to listen to them read their books every night too. The reading bags have almost made the rounds already. They seem to really enjoy them too. Reading is so good for the children and should be done every day!

In math, we will continue working on simple addition and subtraction, math stories, and different ways to show one number. We will be making a grape project to show different equations that equal the same number.

We continue throwing, tossing and passing our bean bags in phy ed. They are finding out that they can be fun too just like the parachute.

We finished our animal unit on Friday and their animals should have back home. This week we start learning about our five senses. We will start with seeing. We will spend about 2-3 days on each sense. We will also start on hearing this week.

We are learning about shape in art. We will be making geometric shapes this week with finger paint and then making prints from our drawings.

We will continue to learn about pitch. Last week we talked about music that is high and low. This week we will see it can be in the middle too.

Grades 1-2

This week we get to do Testing! This is such a wonderful opportunity to check on our progress. Test will take place on Tuesday-Thursday.

In Christ Light this week we will be learning how God encourages his people with the assurance of final victory. We will read the story "The Israelites Enter Canaan" and "Rahab and the Spies".

In Reading, we will begin working on some new vocabulary and sight words. We will read the stories, "Yes, We Want Some Too" and "Eye Spy"

In Science we will work on states of matter. Science got put on hold last week due to my absence. It will be fun to continue in our study. This week we will study solids and liquids.

In Phy. Ed. we will work on volleying a ball. We will start with balloons before moving on to balls. We will have fun trying to volley with partners and using paddles to volley the balloons with.

Memory Treasures continue this week. Check on planbook for the assignments.

Grades 3-5

NWEA testing is planned for Monday, Wednesday, Friday at 9:30 am.

Thank you to everyone that participated in our ice fishing adventure. It was an amazing adventure.

Spelling lesson that we will work on is Lesson 21. We will take the test on Friday.

Catechism class continues to focus on forgiveness. The social studies class is working on early civilization in Rome. Students finish their presentations early this week.

Math lessons are working on multiplication facts and division of single and double digit numbers, and decimals (adding and subtracting).

Students started individual books. Plot will be the skill the students continue to work on for the week. We will look at rising action and what is the climax in the story. Each day students look for 3 new words in the sections they are reading.

Science topics are solid, liquids, and gas especially after being on the ice.

Grades 6-8

This week we start a new topic series entitled "How can I Get Along Better..." w/ (those who are more or less gifted than I am) **Memory Work for this week is Philippians 2:5, 1 Peter 4:10**

Everyone has **unit 20** for spelling this week.

In 8th grade Math the students will review and test the material they have learned in this unit. They will begin a unit on Volume. 7th grade will finish their unit on Geometry and test this week also. They will study angles, triangles and scale drawings. 6th grade will finish their unit on equations and test this week also. They will begin a unit on Functions.

English - 6th grade will finish their chapter on Adjectives and Adverbs and test this week. The 7th and 8th graders will finish their writing chapter this week. I hope to begin their student treasure books next week.

In American History class the 7th and 8th graders are reviewing "Jacksonian Democracy" to ready

themselves for a test this week. They will start a chapter on "Expanding West".

In Science class the students will review the structures of the cell and test this week. They will begin a new chapter titled Cell Reproduction.

This week is also NWEA testing. Everyone will be tested on their Math, Language, and Reading skills. If at all possible please schedule any appointments around our testing time which is 1:00-2:00 pm on Mon., Wen., and Fri.
